

Teacher Lesson Plan

Grade Level: Second/Third Grade Subject: Wudu

Objectives: Objective 1: Review the order of each body part washed in wudu and the number of times it is washed.

Objective 2: Help visual and tactile learners brainstorm good and/or bad deeds that can be committed with the body parts washed in *wudu*. After brainstorming, write the children's ideas on post-it notes to place on the life size body drawing and keep your own list as well. Use this list to make game cards for *Wudu* Charades, *Wudu* Pictionary, and *Wudu* Interactive Skits.

Objective 3: Teach the sunnah and *dua'as* or simple prayers in the children's own language related to each stage of *wudu*. Post-it notes or other paper materials can be used without damaging the drawing.

Materials: ----- Large paper Washable markers, crayons, or colored pencils

Instruction/Procedure:

- 1. Ask children to pair up and trace each other's bodies onto the paper; tape them all together into one large body.
- 2. Paint the tracings with water color or decorate as desired, although not necessary.
- 3. Prepare to use the drawings in a way that will allow you to make changes. For example, cover it with contact paper and plan to use pencils/erasers, post-it notes, tape etc.
- 4. Hang the drawings on the wall as space allows.

5. Use the tracings in conjunction with the *Wudu* Spin the Wheel Game to meet the three learning objectives above.

Variations:

Eventually add in the prophetic *dua'as* that should be said during each part of the *wudu*. You can spend as much time as needed on each *dua'a* before going to the next one. If the children do not know Arabic, make sure they learn the meaning of each *dua'a* in their native tongue. Use the printable found on the Ghazali Children's website for an easy reference to these *dua'as*.
